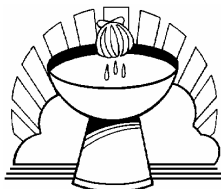

# Pastoral Council Minutes

## September 28, 2005

PRESENT: LuAnn Eifert, Ed Bedore, Kelley Stephens, Steve Warren, Sue Roth, Janet McMinn, Jerry Jasinski, Jason Heiple, Michelle Green, Father Bill, Laura Megown, Carmel Settles, Sue Bozarth.

The meeting opened at 6:40pm with a prayer led by LuAnn Eifert, Jerry Jasinski, and Jason Heiple.

Minutes from the August 24<sup>th</sup> and September 8<sup>th</sup> meeting were reviewed. Janet McMinn asked that Jason continue to report on Youth Ministry until a teen is identified to fill the position. The council agreed upon this request. Motion made by Janet McMinn to approve the minutes of August 24 and September 8<sup>th</sup>. Ed Bedore seconded the motion. Motion was carried.

### Strategic Planning Update and Survey Results

Copies of all responses from both weekends were distributed. Approximately 90 responses have been received--this being a 10% return so far. All were asked to review the responses over the next month and look for emerging themes from which we can set our goals and objectives. Father would like to have 4 or 5 very specific goals set by December 1.

### Sue Bozarth

Sue Bozarth made a presentation regarding a fundraiser to help pay off the Annual Catholic Services Appeal debt that has grown over the past two years. After much research, she has narrowed down a fundraiser selling Twists (not Butterbraids). We have never done such a fundraiser before. Before 1990, the parish did hold carnivals, chili dinners, bazaar, and/or chicken dinners. However, the Twists are not labor intensive. The council agreed to support this fundraiser as a "Debt Reduction" for the ACSA. All monies raised would go directly to the diocese to pay down our debt. Within the next two weeks, we could have a kickoff weekend, with samples of the Twists to be offered after the weekend masses. The first order could be here the weekend before Thanksgiving. Ed Bedore made a motion to approve this fundraiser. Michelle Green seconded the motion.

### Committee Reports

#### **Christian Formation:**

Janet McMinn reported that parent orientation for CF classes was well attended. There are 57 Catechists working with 350 children in the CF classes. In the future, we may have to consider limiting class size and/or offering 2 sessions for each grade. They are working on the change in the bus schedule for transportation from the school and all is going well. On November 16<sup>th</sup>, St. Jude's will host *Protecting God's Children* Awareness session at 6:30pm in the Parish Center. December 4<sup>th</sup> will be the Christmas Party.

#### **Youth:**

Jason Heiple reported that 15 freshman & sophomore students attended World Youth Day this past Sunday. The bonfires held after home football games continue to be a success with nearly 100 students attending. The first SWAT Parents United meeting will be held this Sunday at 1:30pm. The topic is *Attitude is Everything*. An announcement will be made at masses this weekend regarding the Mission trip for high school students next summer to Benton Harbor,

Michigan.

**Parish Life:**

Jerry Jasinski reported the Parish Picnic would be held on October 9<sup>th</sup> following the outdoor mass at 11am at the Rochester Park. Currently 125 have signed up through last Sunday.

**Faith in Action:**

Michelle Green reported that the 10<sup>th</sup> Grade confirmation class will be cooking and serving a meal at St. John's Breadline on November 5 & 6. A clothing drive will be held on October 15 from 8-11am and October 16 after mass. This is a good opportunity to clean out your closets. Your clothes, coats, boots, bedding, blankets and household items will all be donated to St. Martin de Porres Center.

She also suggested we adopt a parish in the Biloxi diocese to help them rebuild after Hurricane Katrina. Father Bill suggested a parish in similar size and that this would take a couple of years to help them get back on their feet.

**Father Bill's Comments**

Father reported that all members of the parish council and all employees of the church would be given name tags to be worn every time you are at St. Jude's.

He indicated a Stewardship Committee has been formed and he has asked Marian & Hartzel Bruno, Rick & Nancy Atkinson, Don & Carolyn Werner, and Sergio & Joan Molino to serve on the committee. They will be establishing a theme for the year that will be woven throughout the whole parish and all parish activities. Father and the Werners will be attending a stewardship conference next week in San Francisco. Along with this theme, an emblem (symbol) has been created by Jeff Garland that will be used on all materials throughout the year. The monthly newsletter has been named Faithful. This newsletter will be mailed monthly to all households in the parish.

Father is excited about the outdoor mass scheduled for Sunday at the Park prior to the Parish Picnic. Mike Greer has agreed to help with the sound system and play music during the picnic. Father asked that a member of the Parish Council talk at the masses this weekend encouraging attendance at the outdoor mass and the picnic.

He gave an update on the land issues. The money has been received for the land sold to county and the money is in the bank. Crops at two sites are doing better this fall than last year. We have already received one check for \$20,000 for our portion. We are still negotiating on the Scott property (22+ acres).

LuAnn Eifert thanked both Sue Roth and Vicky Walker for their efforts in putting together the responses to the questionnaires.

With no other issues or concerns, the meeting closed with a prayer and was adjourned at 8:30pm.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 26 at 6:30pm.
