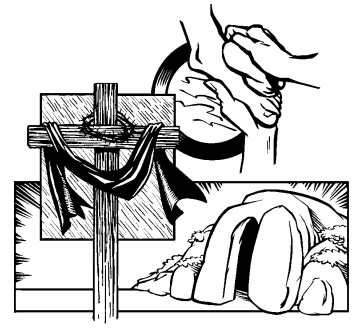
Special Collections

THE TRIDUUM (THE THREE DAYS)

HOLY THURSDAY
April 13th - 5:45 PM



We begin our Triduum celebration with the Mass of the Lord's supper. On this night we celebrate the Eucharist - not as a passive observation of a ritual, but as an active acceptance of Jesus' real presence. We do this by engaging ourselves in service to one another. Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and told us to go and do the same. To carry out Jesus' mission is to be in service to one another. This "Mandatum" (commandment) defines us as church

GOOD FRIDAY
April 14th - 5:45 PM

The sober service of this "day of days" is not despondent or even mournful. It speaks of the love and sacrifice of Jesus in our behalf. "We do not mourn as those without faith" but understand that "by his bruises we are healed". The texts of this liturgy reveal a confident (though restrained) joy in the fact that the cross is the symbol of victory and the door to life. To Venerate the Cross is to venerate the person of Jesus and what his sacrifice means in terms of his love for us. This Friday is "Good" because it is the day on which sin and death did their worst... and it was not enough. Jesus died battered, beaten, exhausted, suffering, wracked with pain... yet still trusting and confident in God's loving care. THAT was his triumph!



EASTER VIGIL
April 15th - 7:00 PM

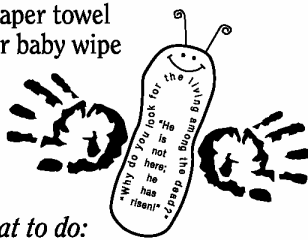
At the Vigil, the parish family gathers together for an evening of watching and praying. The liturgy is centered on the font because we are baptized people. All our life long, we are living out what happened to us in the water of baptism. This is the night we celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with those seeking to become members of the Catholic faith. In the midst of our parish family these adults will be baptized, confirmed and will join us at the table for the first time.

Make a **HANDPRINT BUTTERFLY**

The butterfly is a symbol of new life and of the Resurrection. After three days, Jesus rose from the dead and gave us hope for a new life.

What you need:

- Bible verse Luke 24:5-6 (NIV)
- tempera paint or acrylic paint
- paintbrush
- 1 sheet of light-colored construction paper
- paper towel or baby wipe

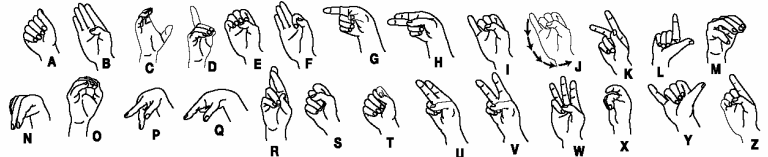


What to do:

1. Draw a picture of a butterfly's body. Make it wide enough to write this verse inside the body:
- "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!"*
 Luke 24:5-6 (NIV)
2. Use the paintbrush to paint the palm of your hand.
 3. Make a butterfly wing with your handprint by pressing your hand down next to the butterfly body.
 4. Clean your hand with the paper towel or baby wipe.
 5. Repeat steps 2-4 with the other hand.
 6. Let the butterfly remind you of the sacrifice Jesus made for us and of the beauty of his Resurrection.

"Behold my hands and my feet ..." Luke 24:39 (KJV)
