In September all parishioners will be given the opportunity to sign-up for various ministries where you will be able to share your time and talent with the parish. So for the next several weeks we will highlight a few of the ministries.

Parish Life Commission

Parish Life Commission Member

The Parish Life Commission coordinates the "social life of our parish" by providing opportunities for the members of the St. Jude family to relax, to enjoy each other's company and to get to know each other better. In addition, this group is often called on to help other commissions to plan their social events.

Coffee and Donuts

Coffee and donuts play an important part in building a warm community spirit at St. Jude's. As a way of hospitality, we serve coffee and donuts after the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday. Volunteers are needed to pick up the donuts and make the coffee.

Harvest Feast

A group to plan, organize and coordinate our annual Harvest Feast, a meal of Thanksgiving in which the whole parish is invited to share.

Parish Picnic

A group to plan, organize and coordinate our annual Parish Picnic.

Souper Supper

Assist in preparation (cooking and set-up), serving, or clean-up at our annual soup and breads supper held on the last Saturday in January, following the 5:30PM Mass. Help is also needed on the day of the Harvest Feast to help cook and de-bone turkeys in the afternoon.

Mardi Gras

In collaboration with the Christian Formation Program and the Youth Commission, volunteers would help to prepare a meal for the celebration.

Social Concerns Commission

Christmas Friends

"Friends" is a giving program that provides Christmas Gifts for the needy. Through the program, the parishioners of St. Jude's provide new clothing, toys, food and gifts for the less fortunate in the area communities. Besides adopting a friend, individuals are needed for one day around Christmas to help deliver Christmas presents to St. Patrick's School which serves as a distribution center to neighborhood families.

School Friends

Parish members are needed to provide new back-to-school supplies for those in need. This is an opportunity to help those less fortunate than ourselves.

Food and Clothing Outreach

The parish collects food at the masses each weekend. We need parishioners who are willing to take to St. Martin de Porres Center at least every two weeks. These same individuals may be called upon to gather and delivery clothing to St. Martin de Porres Center.

Habitat for Humanity

Parish members are needed to help build a home for someone in need or help supply food for Habitat workers. This is an excellent way to help those less fortunate than ourselves. Commitments can be as small as making sandwiches for one meal and as large as helping put on a roof.

Recycling of Aluminum Cans

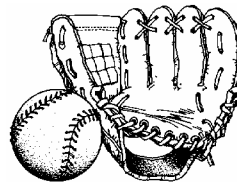
Parish volunteers pick-up the aluminum cans at the parish center and take them to recycling center. This task is done on a rotating basis. Profits from the aluminum can collection go to St. Patrick's School.

Community Care

Each October, parishioners are asked to select one of six - eight service opportunities and commit to a few hours of public service over the course of a year, with an emphasis on families serving together. In 2006-2007, the opportunities included St. John's Breadline, Mini O'Beirne Crisis Nursery, the Ronald McDonald House, Helping Hands Shelter, St. Joseph's Nursing Home, the Salvation Army, the Hospital Sisters of St. Francis Mission Outreach, and the local needs of the Rochester community.

Additional Outreach

Throughout the year, the Commission undertakes individual outreach efforts such as preparing and delivering meals to a homeless shelter. All parishioners are welcome to join us when they can.
