The "50 days" of Easter concludes with the feast of Pentecost. The promised Advocate, the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles as in tongues of fire. Some recognize this feast as the Birthday of the Church. The Paschal

Candle is carried out at the end of each Sunday Mass as we who are filled with the Holy Spirit are to go out and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus to the world in our words and actions. May our prayer this week be:

"Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and enkindle in us the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and we shall be re-created, And You shall renew the face of the earth.

Let us Pray

O God, Who by the light of the Holy Spirit did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant us by the same Holy Spirit a love and relish of what is right and just, and the constant enjoyment of His consolation through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Ordinary Time: This week the Church begins the "Ordinal" time, i.e. that of counting the weeks between the special seasons of the liturgical year. However, as we begin the **9th week** in Ordinary Time, on the next two Sundays, the Church honors two special doctrines of our Catholic faith. Next Sunday, June 7, is the **Feast of the Blessed Trinity**. God, though one, has revealed himself in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Church honors the **Body and Blood of Christ**, the Sacrament of Holy Communion on June 14.

Prayers for the Church:

The Rosary is offered at 7:30 am, Monday through Friday for the intentions of our Holy Father, the Intentions written in our Book of Requests and our parish bulletin, as well as the personal intentions of those in attendance. At 8:30 am, The Parish Staff (and anyone else interested in joining us) prays Morning Prayer, the Official Prayer of the Church in the Liturgy of the Hours. The intentions are also included. If you have a special need, you may call the parish office or write them in the Book of Requests at Church to add your intentions to these prayers.
